Read Ezekiel 38-39

- These chapters are apocalyptic, i.e. highly symbolic.
- There are several interpretive approaches to these chapters, some worthy, some not.
- These chapters indicate that at some point in the future (of Ezekiel's time) the territory of God's people would be invaded by hordes from the north.
- The basic theme is that God will protect his people and destroy their enemy.
- Ezekiel 38 focuses on the foe that will come against God's people.
- Ezekiel 39 focuses on the results of the victory over Gog:

• God spoke in the past about Gog's invasion. Some suggest Isaiah 34:2, 66:15-18;

Jeremiah 4:5ff, Zephaniah 1, but these may refer to something else. The point is the

invasion would not take God by surprise.

Results of the Victory (39:1-29)

Dramatic Destruction (39:1-8)

- Compare what God would do with what Gog would do. (v. 2-6)

Complete Destruction (39:9-20)

Ultimate Vindication (39:21-24)

• How would God's handling of Gog vindicate Him among Israel and the nations?

Final Consolation (39:25-29)

- How is the relationship between God and His people after the captivity described?
