Theme: Be Glad To Go Worship!
 The Joy of Worship. (1-2) What was/is the house of the Lord? Define "glad"
Why is Jerusalem a significant city?
 The Unity of Worship. (3-5) The design of the city is used as a spiritual illustration. Why do the tribes go up? Whose thrones are there?
• The Peace of Worship. (6-9)
 How could they have peace?
What lessons can we learn today from the words of this psalm?

Dividing the Psalms

The Book of Psalms is divided into 5 sub-books:

- Book 1 (Psalms 1-41)
- Book 2 (Psalms 42–72)
- Book 3 (Psalms 73-89)
- Book 4 (Psalms 90–106)
- Book 5 (Psalms 107–150)

Each book closes with a song of praise (doxology or benediction).

We don't really know why the Psalms are divided this way. The dead sea scrolls have them divided into these 5 books and in the order we have them today. Some think the dividing into 5 books is somehow connected symbolically to the first five books of the Bible (Pentateuch or Torah).
