- Chapters 1-12 tell us of the work of Peter and others. Chapters 13-28 tell us
 - of the work of Paul and his preaching companions (Luke was among them).
- As Luke gave an orderly account of the life of Jesus, he continues in the same manner with this writing.
- While these events take place shortly after Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection the date of the writing is thought to be in the early 60's A.D.
